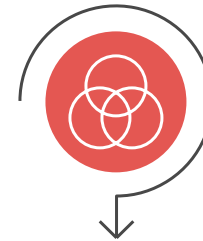

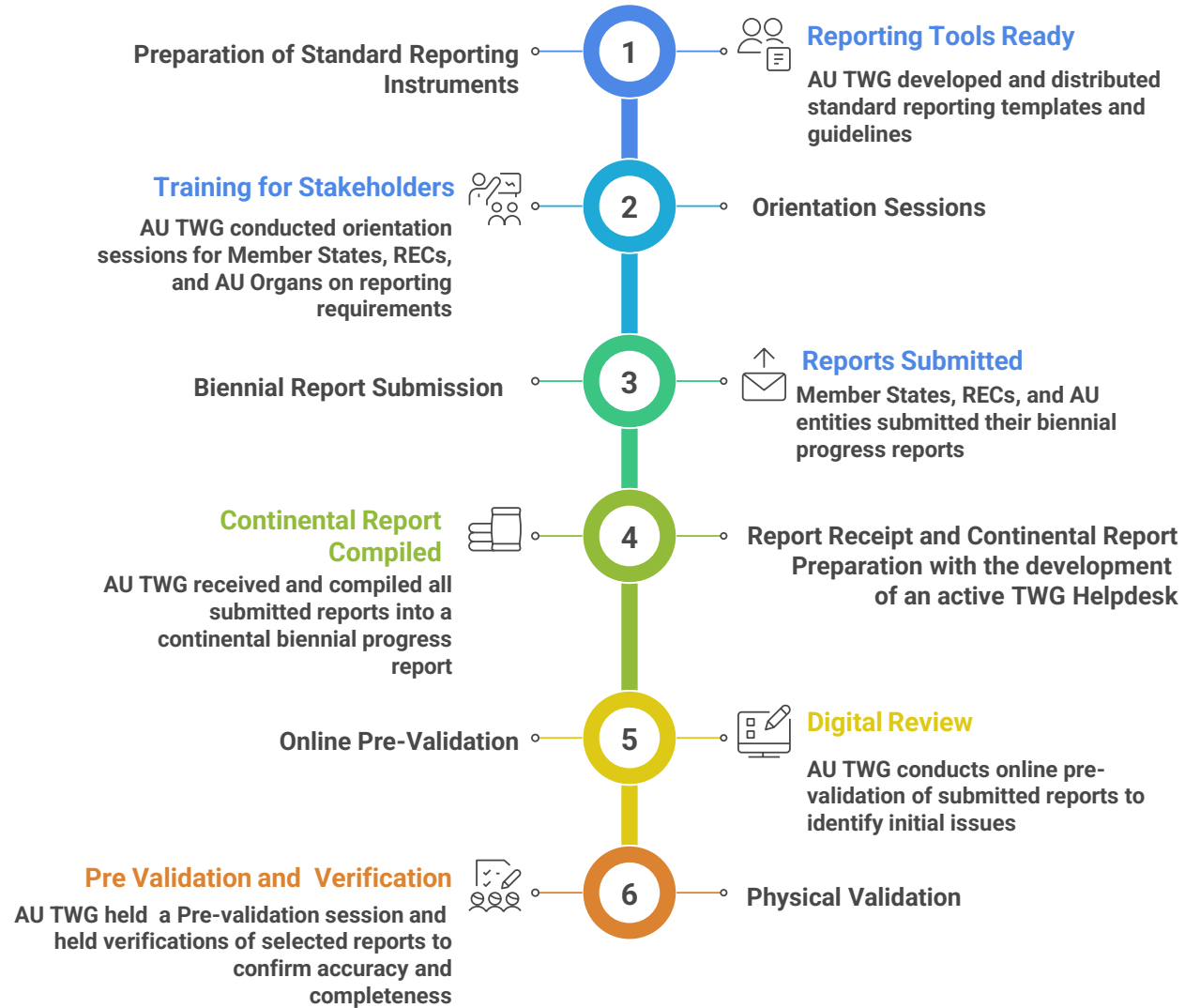

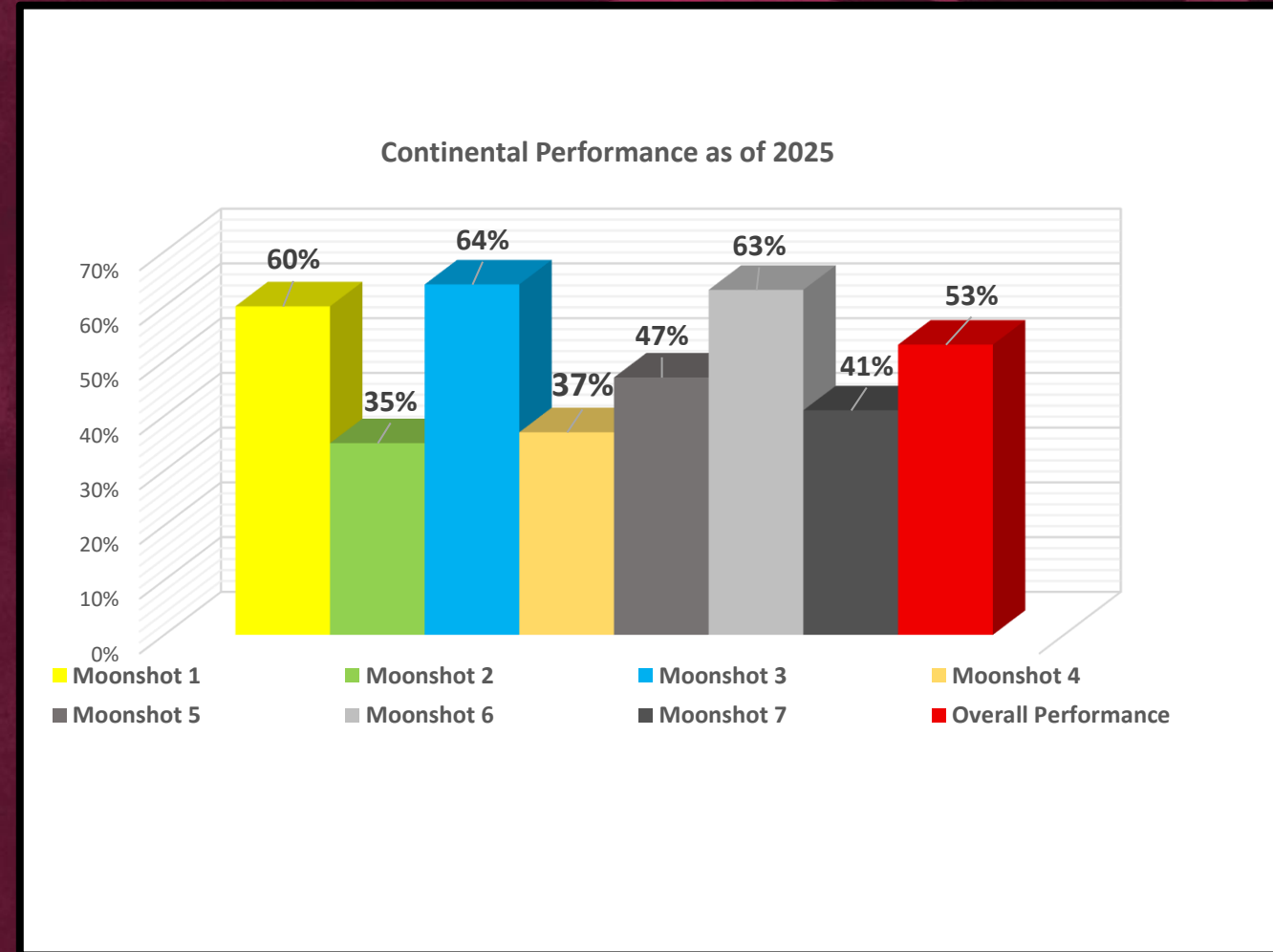

03. OVERALL CONTINENTAL PERFORMANCE

- ❑ **Moderately positive but uneven pattern of performance across the seven Moonshots, with an overall implementation score of 53%.**
- ❑ **Moonshot 3 (Public Institutions)** recorded a performance of **64%**, reflecting relatively strong progress in strengthening governance frameworks, digitalization of public services, enhancing planning systems and capacities, and aspects of public-sector responsiveness
- ❑ **Enablers score – 79%**



04. PERFORMANCE BY MOONSHOTS

Moonshot 1 – Every AU Member State Attains at Least Middle – Income Status

❑ **Key achievements:** Poverty reduction, improved access to services and agricultural gains

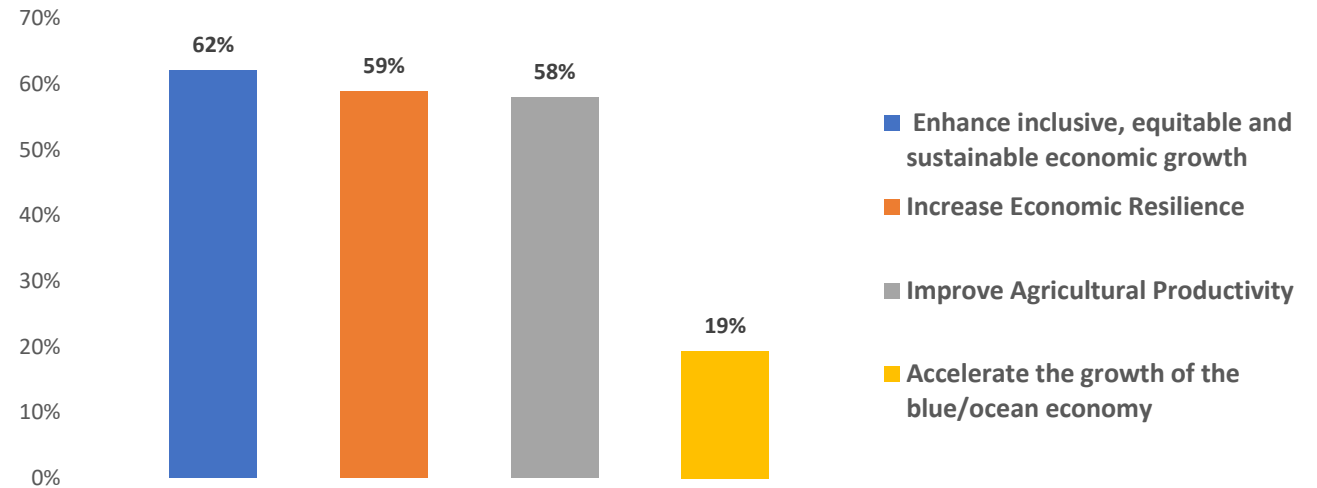
❑ **Key Flagship linkages:**

❑ **Key Constraints:**

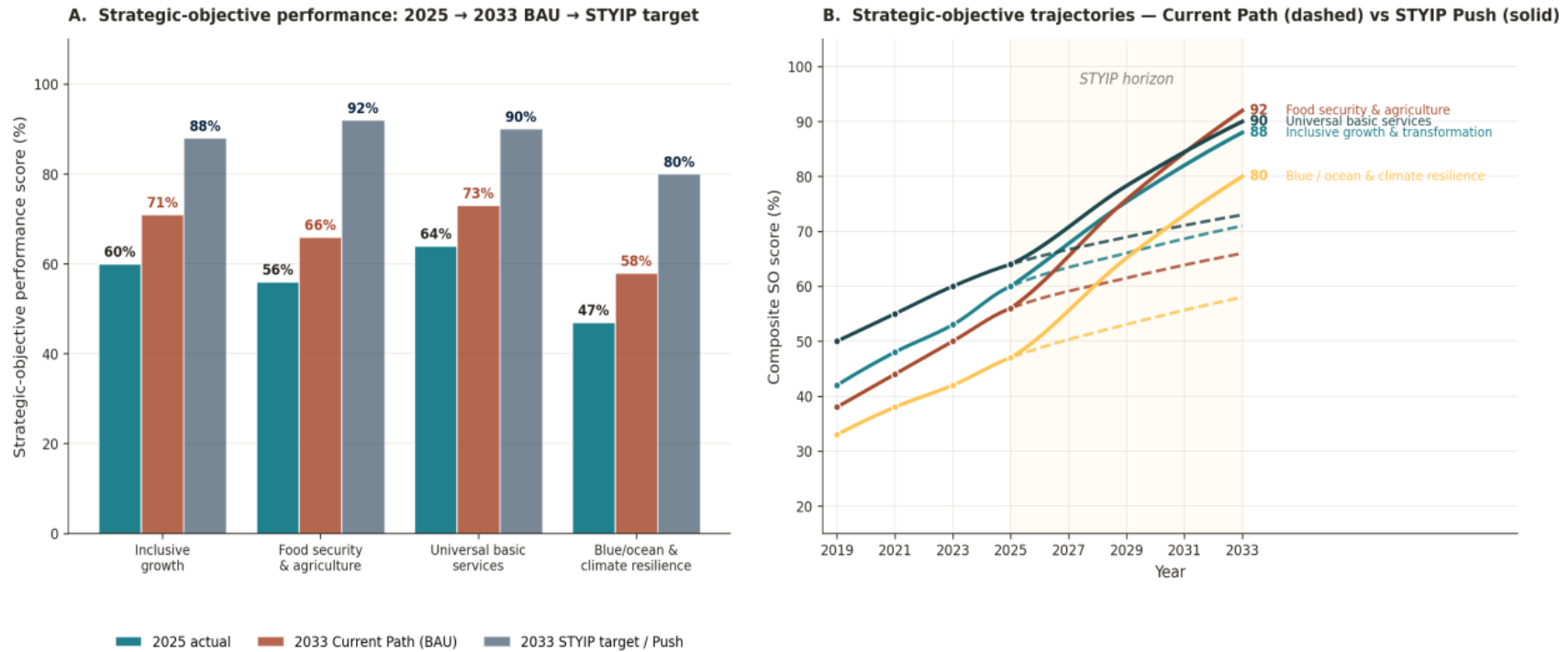

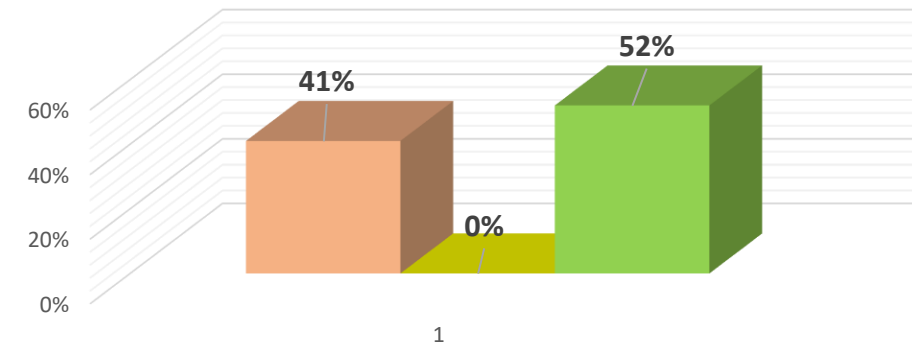
Performance of Strategic Objectives under Moonshot 1 — 2019-2025 actuals and 2033 scenarios



04. Moonshot 2 – Africa is more integrated and connected

- ❑ **Key achievements:** Digital connectivity, AfCFA momentum
- ❑ **Key Flagship linkages:** (AfCFTA, SAATM, AfSEM, AIRN)
- ❑ **Key Constraints:**
 - Infrastructure financing
 - Weak trade facilitation
 - Slow financial integration

Performance of Strategic Objectives under Mooshot 2



- Strengthen institutional capacity for effective implementation of Africa's integration frameworks
- Strengthen the integration of African Financial Eco-system
- Build world class infrastructure for Africa's Economic Development

04. Moonshot 2 – Africa is more integrated and connected

Two strategic objectives, one governance story — institutions outpacing democratic-values practice

SO1 — Democratic values, HR, justice

61% achieved

Judicial independence (perception)

12% → 44%

Voter turnout in elections

62.4% → 63.7%

Driven by reforms incl. Burundi, Sierra Leone

SO2 — Capable institutions & leadership

67% achieved

Corruption Perceptions Index (score)

34.8 → 34.9

Public-sector transformation indicators

— → Improving

Corruption stagnation flagged as binding constraint

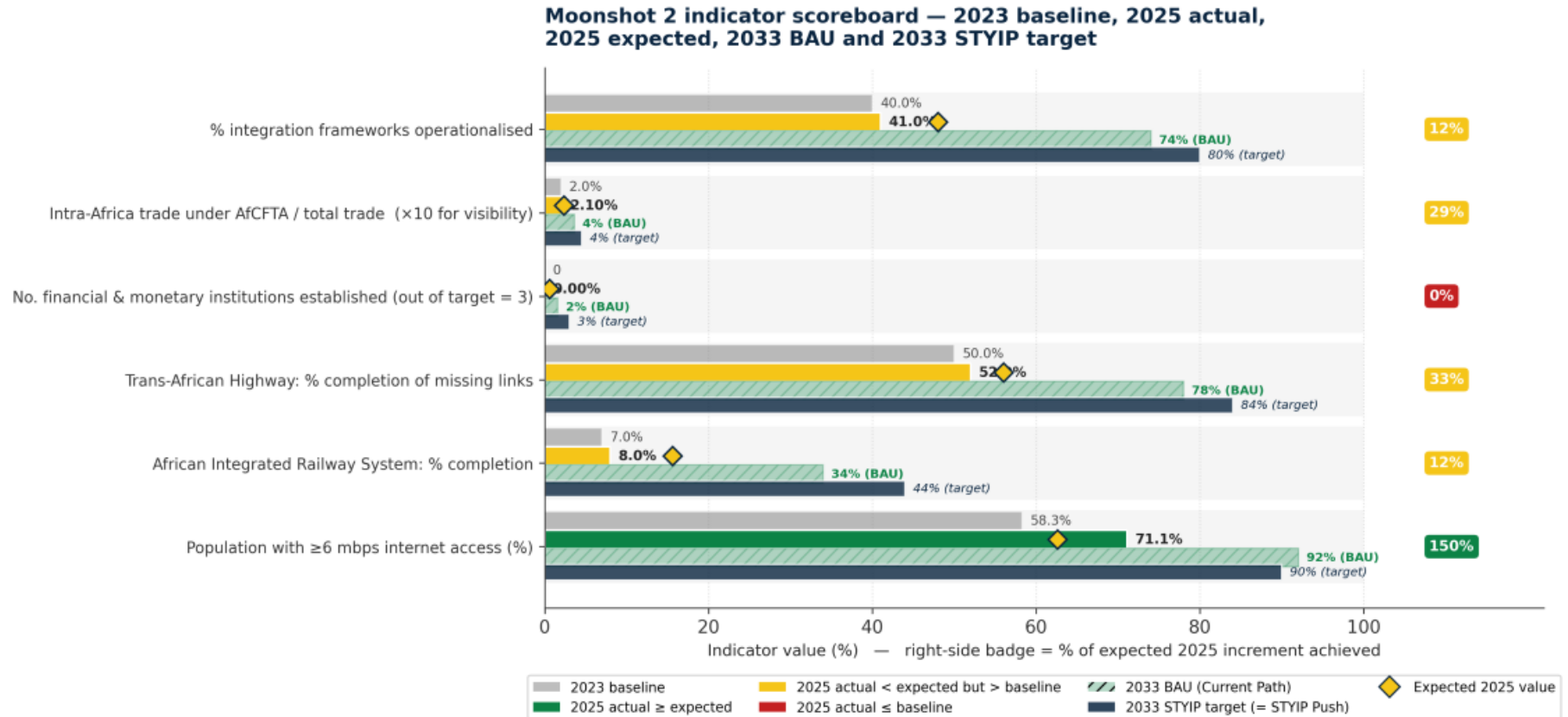
Reading the two strategic objectives together

Institutional capacity is rising faster than democratic-values practice.

Peer-learning frontier: how institutional reforms can be paired with civic-trust gains — without one outpacing the other.

Anti-corruption remains the binding constraint across both SOs.

04. Moonshot 2 indicator Scoreboard

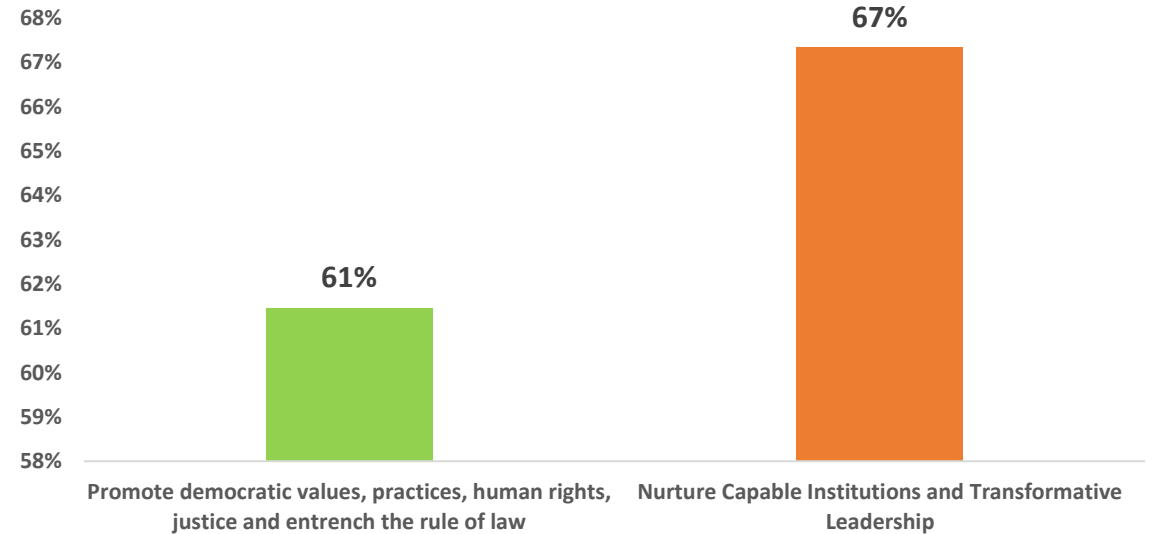

04. Moonshot 3 – Public Institutions are more responsive

- ❑ **Key achievements:** Digital governance, public service reforms, judicial effectiveness
- ❑ **Constraints:**
 - Corruption perception
 - Weak subnational delivery
 - Citizen trust deficits

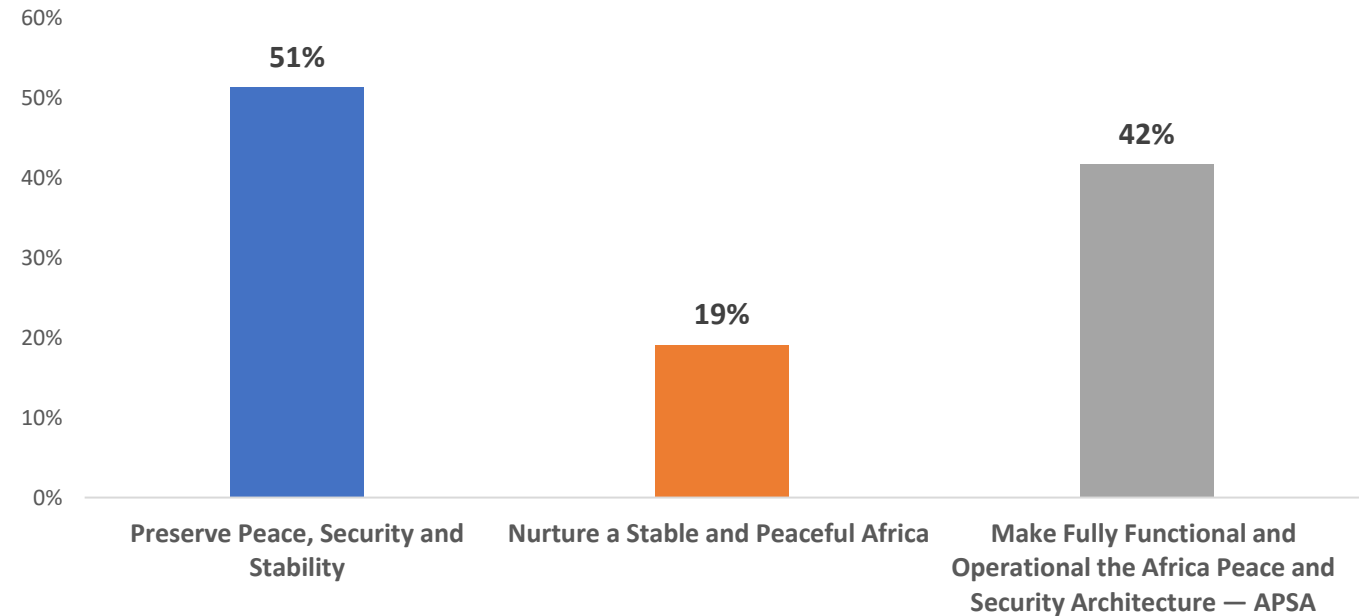

04. Moonshot 4 Africa resolves conflicts peacefully

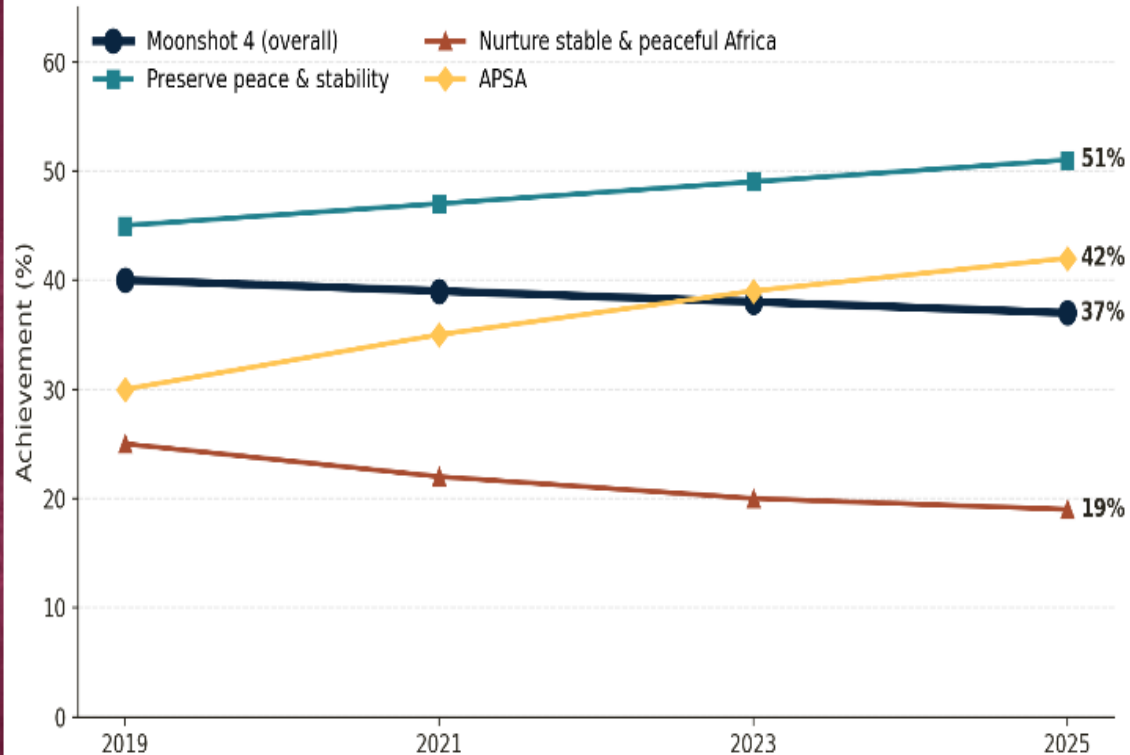
- ❑ **Key achievements:** Mediation Systems, APSA strengthening and preventive diplomacy
- ❑ **Constraints:**
 - Persistent violences in pockets of the continent
 - Financing and peacebuilding gaps

04. Moonshot 4 Deeper analysis of Indicator performance

Moonshot 4 trajectory: preservation efforts strengthening, but nurturing structural peace declining



Moonshot 4 priority areas: progress on preservation and APSA, structural peace deteriorating

Preserve peace, security & stability

↑ Improving

Risk index 2.62 → 2.44 • Trans-boundary mediation 20→30% • PCRD 25→35%



Nurture stable & peaceful Africa

↓ Declining

Armed conflicts 16 → 15 • Militia engagement 24→22 • Inter-country mediation 5→7%

04. Moonshot 5 African values are explicit and promoted

- ❑ **Moderate performance score of 47%**
- ❑ **Key achievements:** Creative economy and heritage initiatives, African languages and education
- ❑ **Constraints:**
 - Data and measurement gaps

Strategic Importance of cultural identity, emerging priorities and strategic implications.

Moonshot 5 indicators: every measure improving since 2019, but pace still moderate

Indicator	2019/23		2025	Δ
Citizens regard African values as important	84%	→	89%	+5.0
Citizens practising African values	72%	→	75%	+3.0
Functional national museums / cultural centres	73%	→	75%	+2.0
Visitors to museums & cultural centres	35.2%	→	38.6%	+3.4
Swahili and Arabic in school curricula	41%	→	43%	+2.0

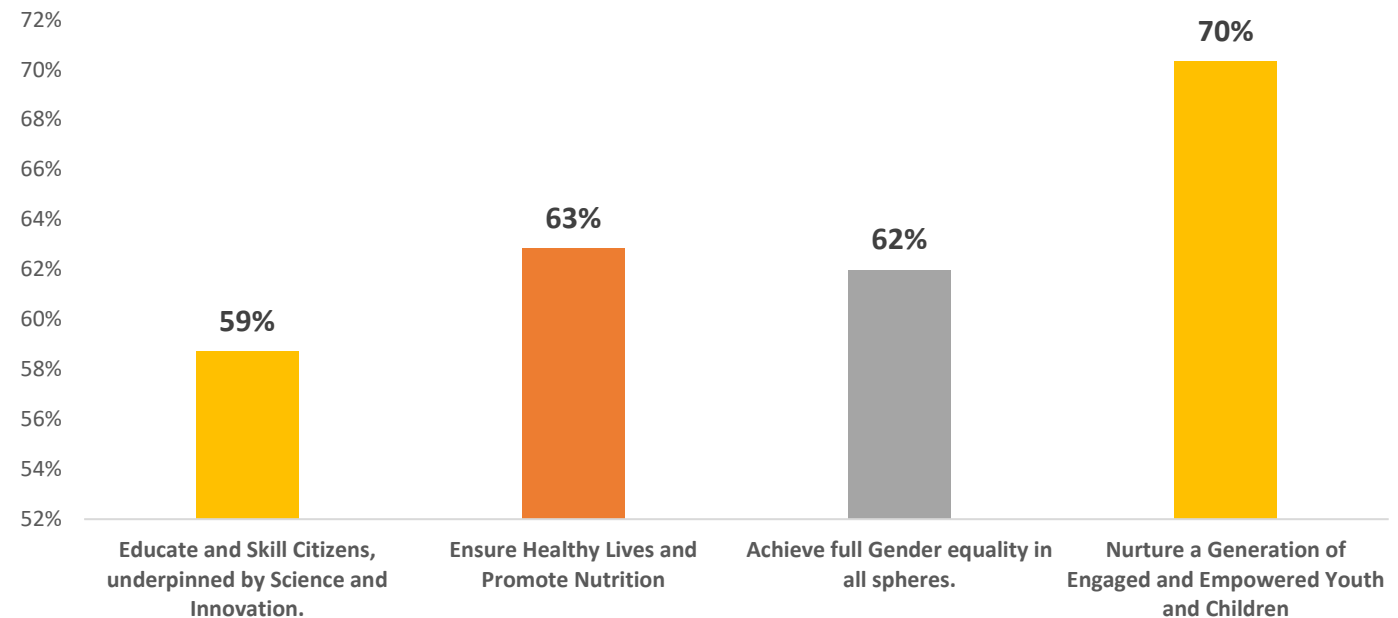
04. Moonshot 6 – African Citizens are more empowered and productive

❑ **Key achievements:** advanced continental efforts to place **African citizens at the centre of development**, emphasizing inclusion, empowerment, and capability-building as drivers of inclusive growth and structural transformation.

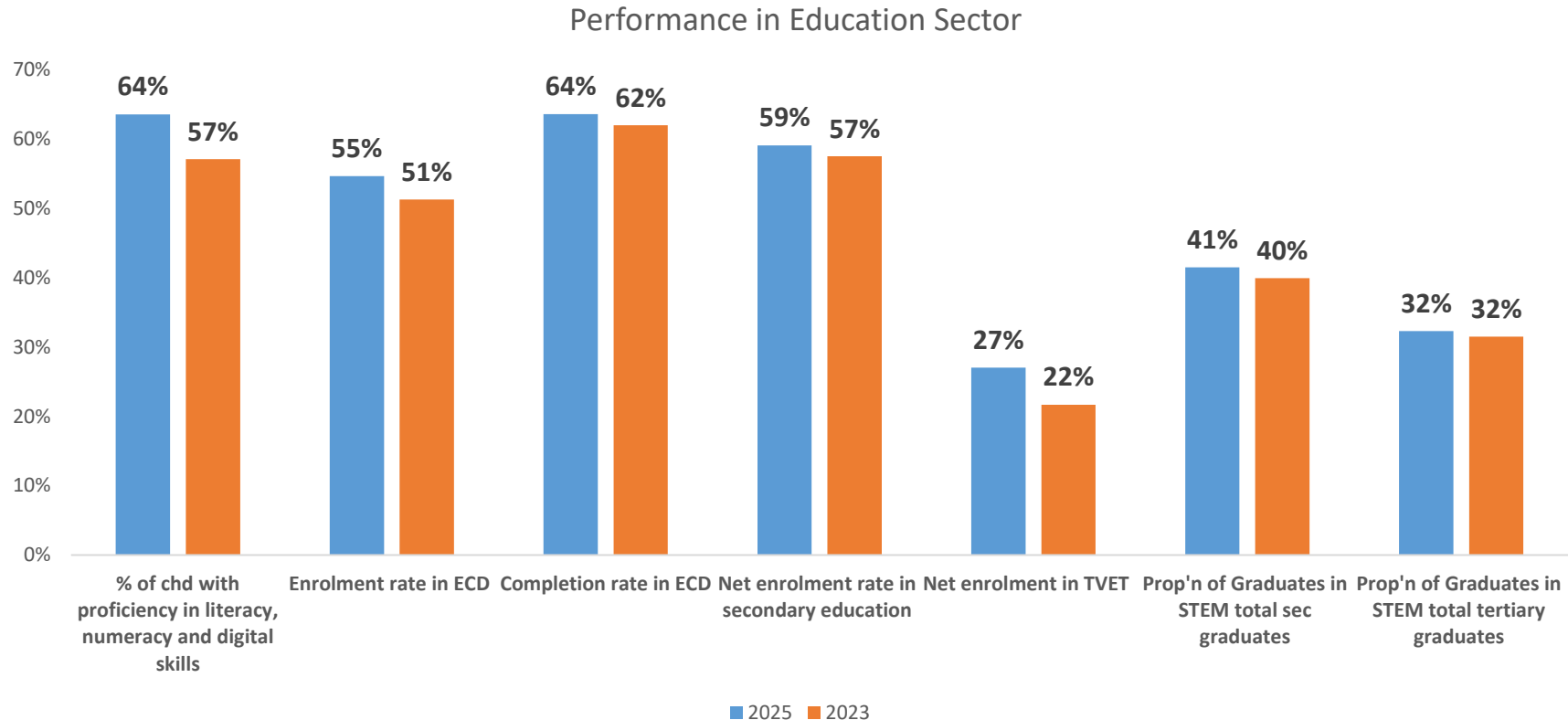
❑ **Constraints:**

- Persistent youth unemployment and skills mismatch
- Need to strengthen productive inclusion

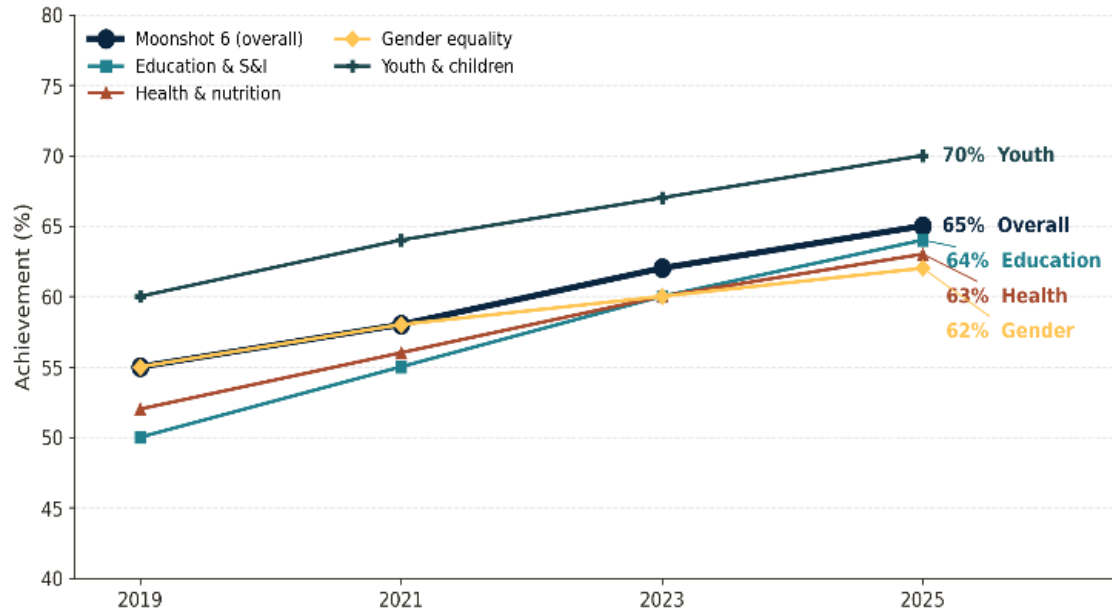

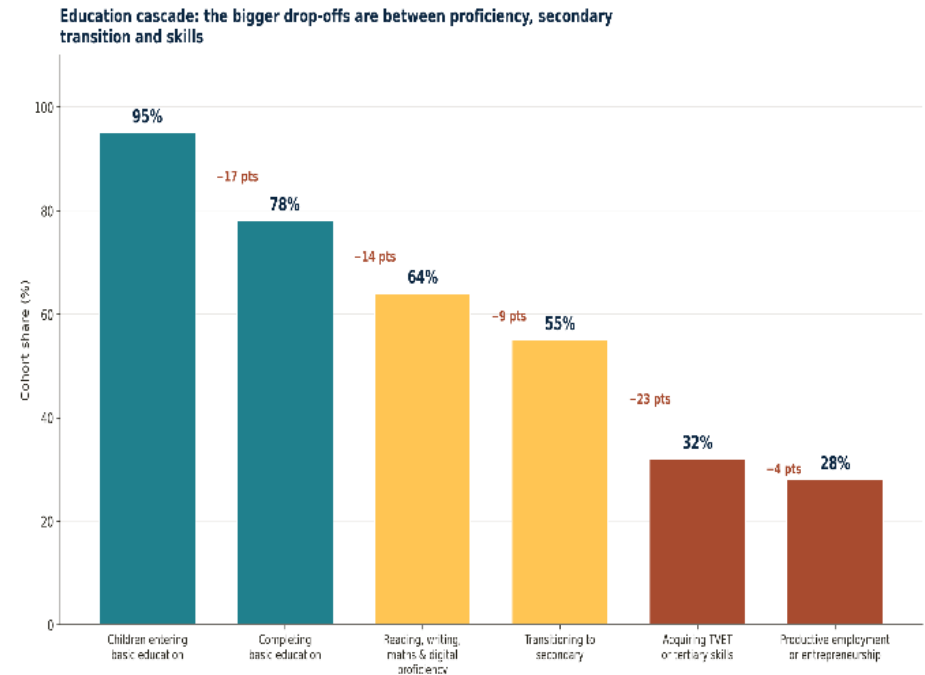
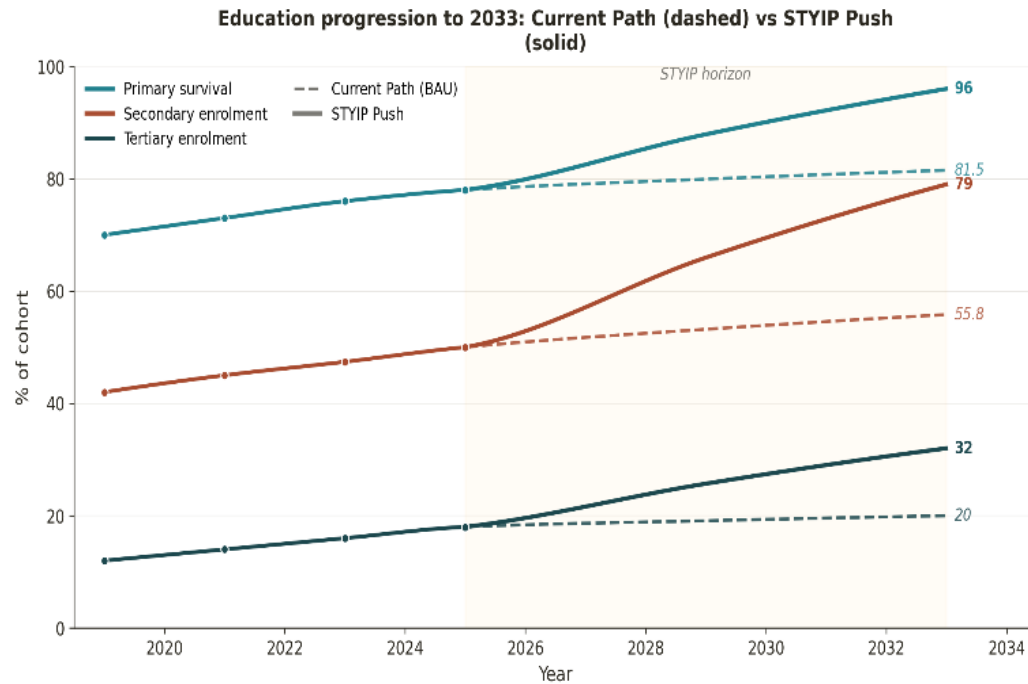
Moonshot 6 trajectory: people-centred development advancing across all four sub-pillars

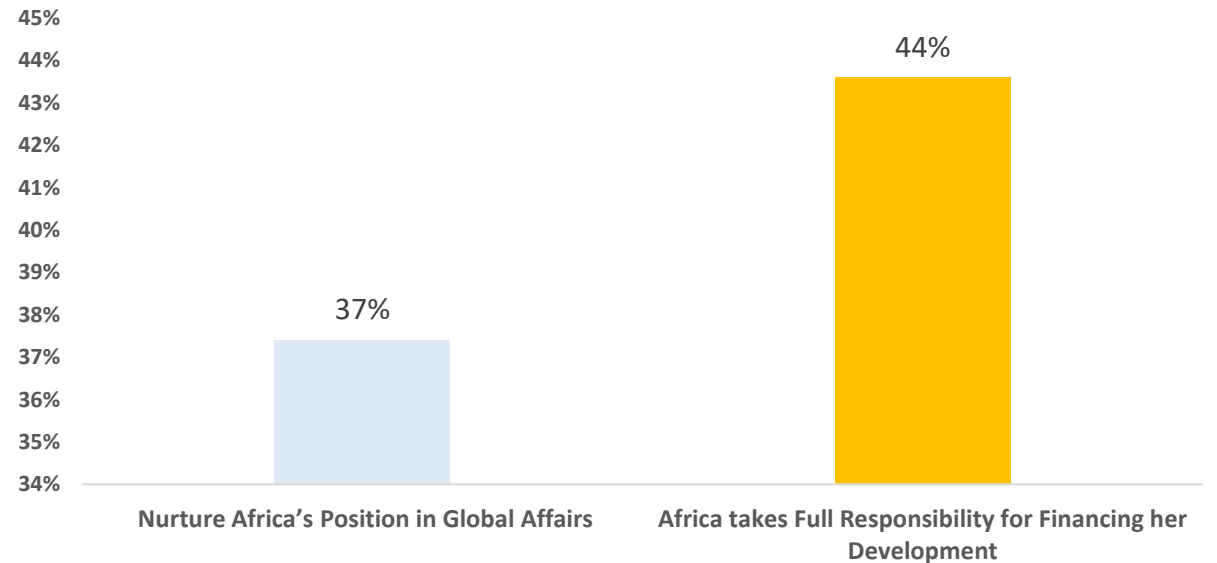

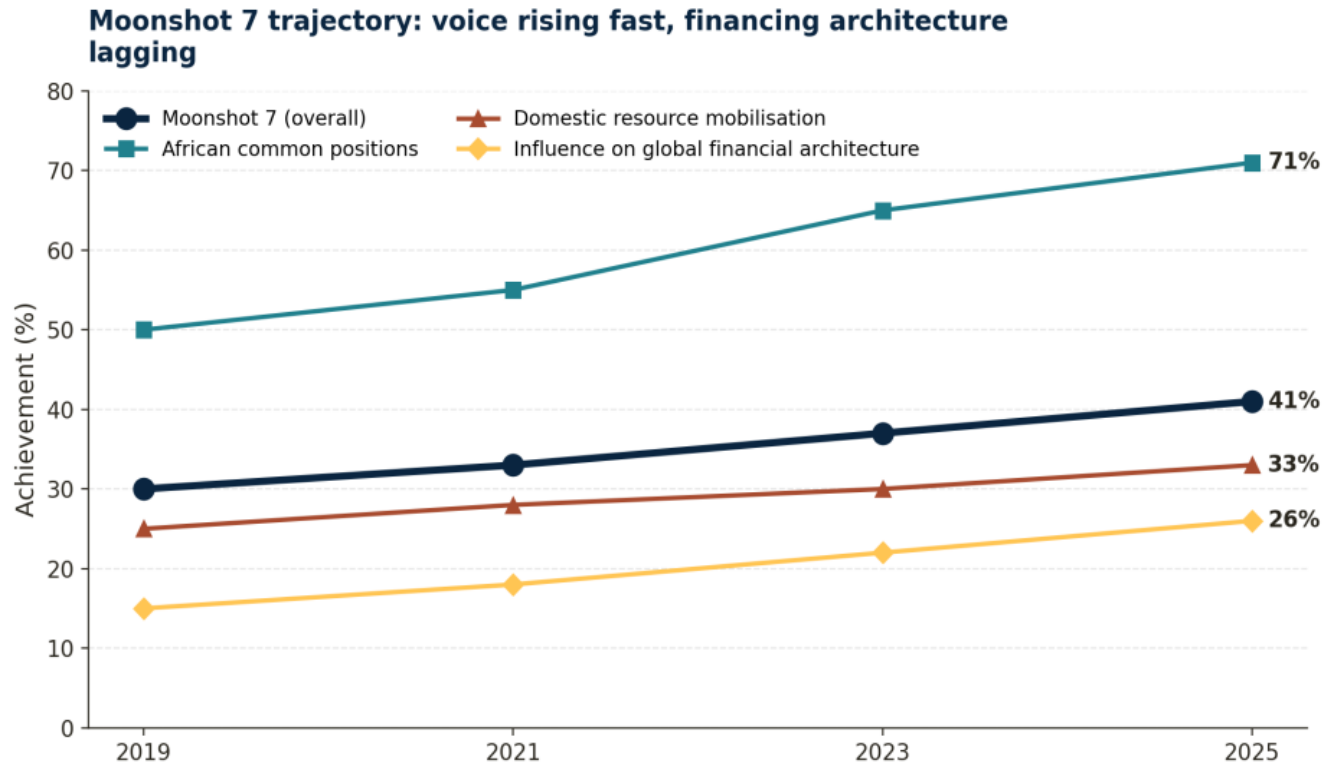
04. Moonshot 7 – Africa is a strong and influential Global Player

- ❑ **Constraints:**
 - Debt vulnerability
 - Limited capital markets
 - External financing dependence

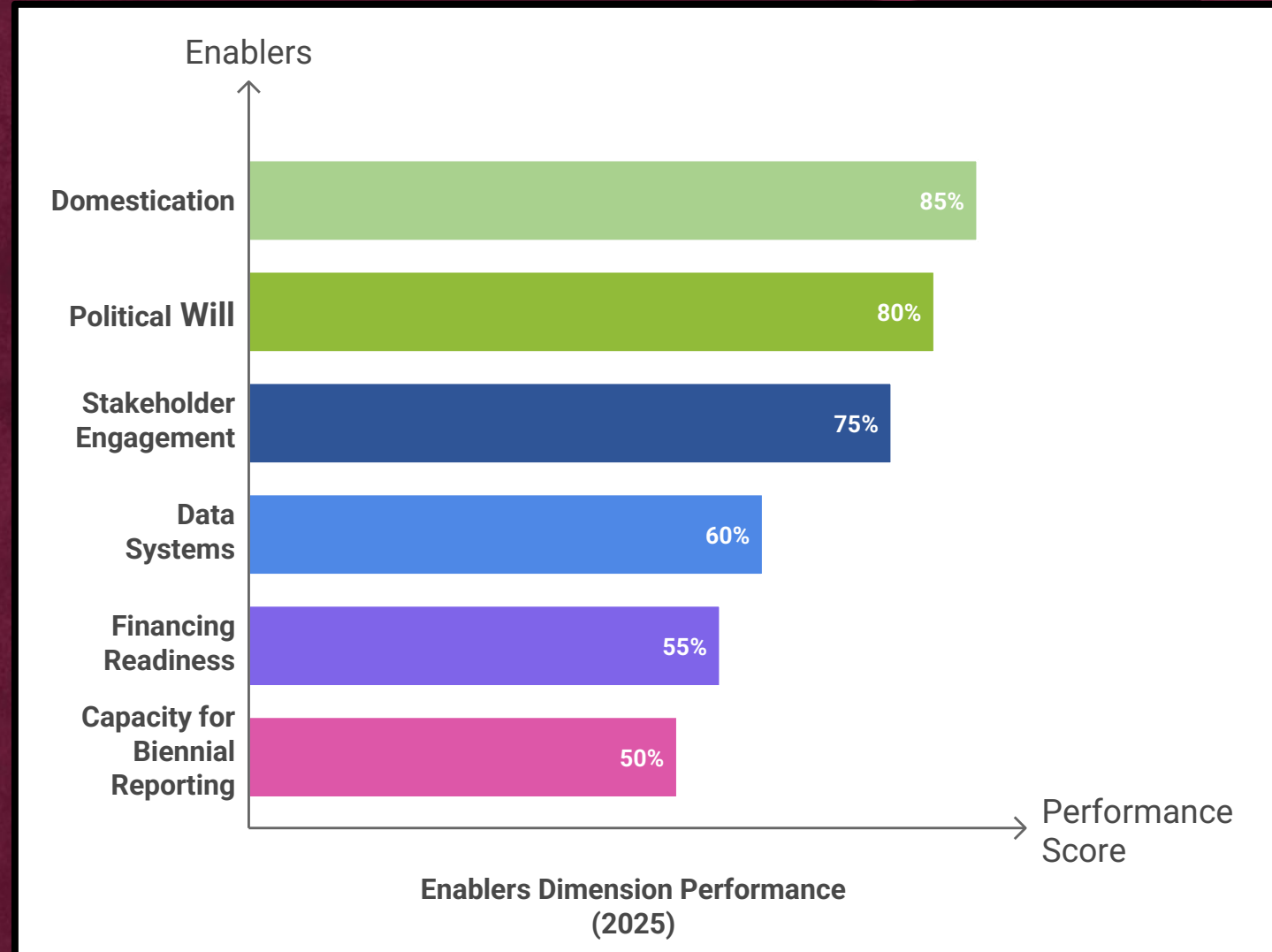

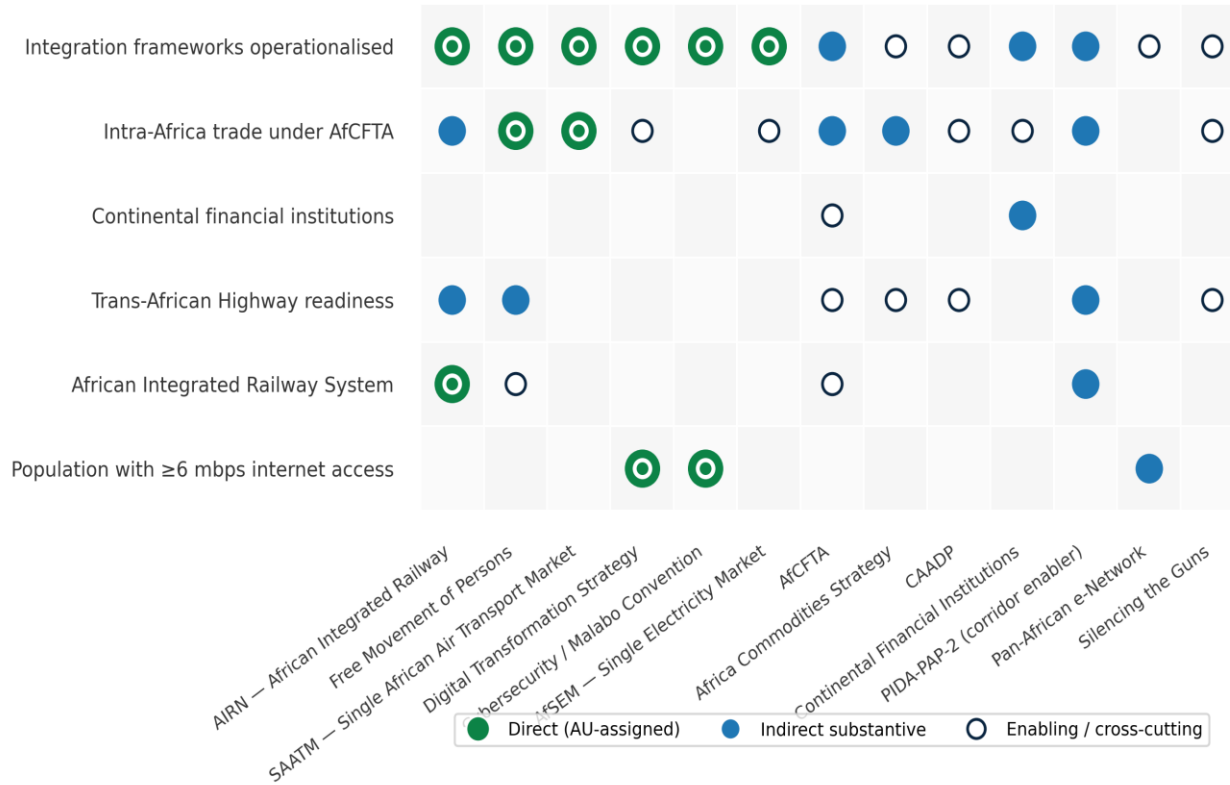
- ❑ **Key enablers:** Domestication, Political will, Stakeholder engagement

 - Adequate resourcing (human and financial)



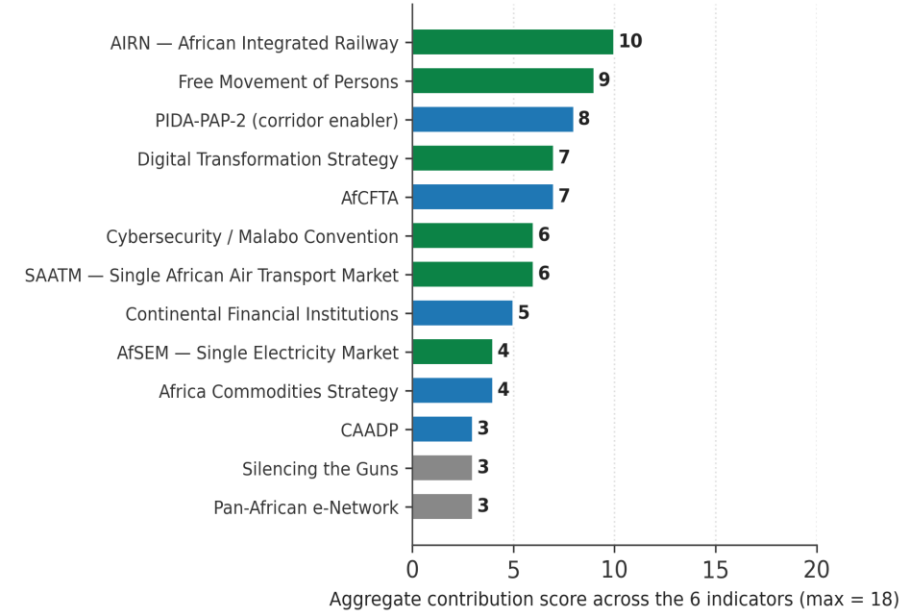

Flagship Projects in the Moonshot 2 results chain — direct, indirect and enabling

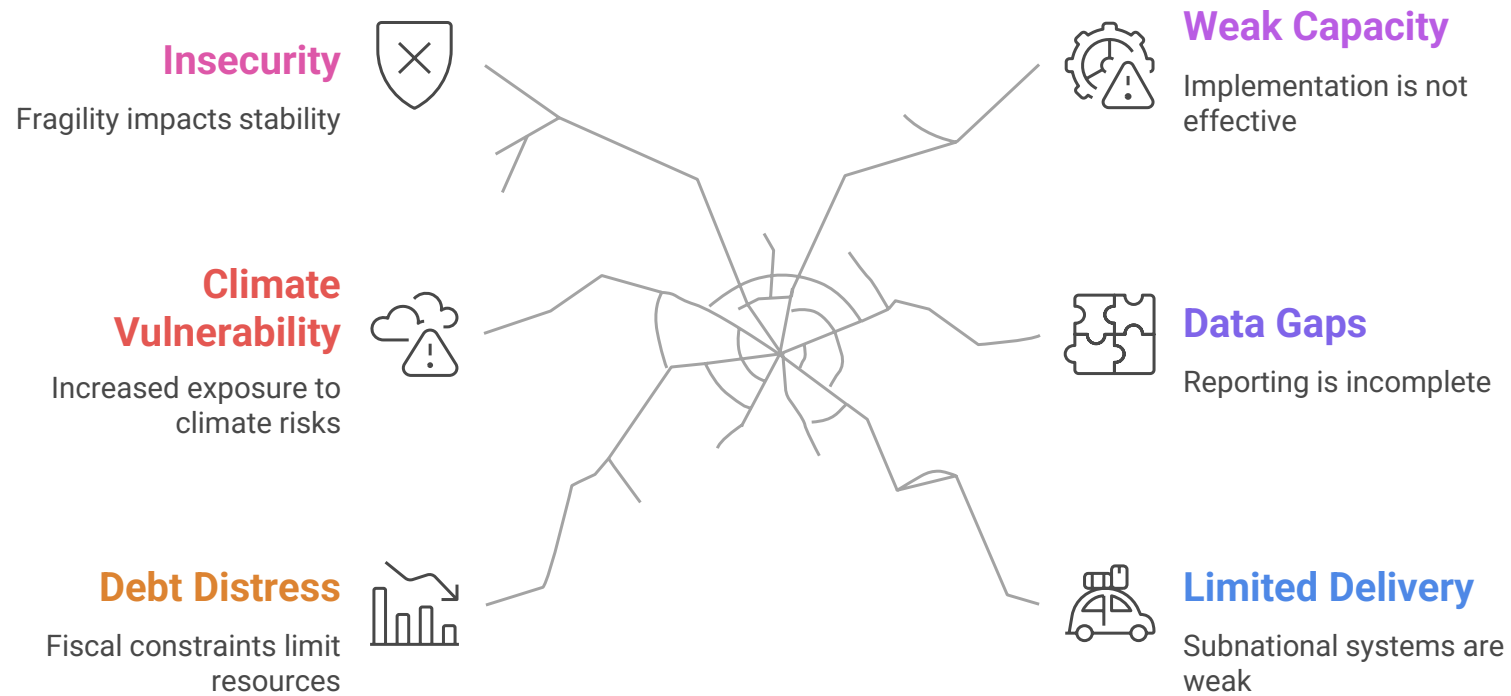
A. Flagship → Moonshot-2 indicator linkage matrix
